

## Reload.

Recently I finished reading the book 'Reload' by Jossiv Kim, and today I would like to share my opinion about this book. It is so poorly written that I would have to stop and re-read pages to figure out what the hell was going on. Despite my numerous attempts and my profound knowledge of this period of the history of Russia, I was unable to find any meaningful idea behind the events described in the book. In the end, 'Reload' appeared to be just another pathetic work, which only showcases the self-praising ideas of a person weak both in terms of mind and ethical values. What is more interesting is that the whole book is meaningless and has no value at all! The author's mind has constructed all the arguments that Kahn, former USSR Marine Officer who is the main character of the book, uses from a set of pre-convinced notions that have never been examined on the basis of real facts.

In a nutshell, the book 'Reload' by Jossiv Kim is a badly written book.
